Three years later, that time came. One night, I was in bed reading when something caught my eye. It was my eighth birthday.

I turned and saw Someone standing by the nightstand. He was bent over and writing something on a piece of paper.

Even though I couldn't see His face, I knew it was Jesus.

He straightened up, looked at me

and said, “Ask.” I figured He was asking me what I wanted for my birthday, so I said, “Heal my mom!” He said, “Done!” and disappeared.

I was so excited! It happened so fast! I started shouting for Mom and she ran in.

“You're healed!” I told her. “Jesus just healed you!”

When I told Mom what happened, she didn't know what to feel or believe because

she was still in pain.

Then I told her the whole story again. When I got to the part about Him writing something on the nightstand, her eyes got watery. She told me that that was the exact spot where she writes things in the night when everyone else is asleep.

It was her place with God.

You see, Mom is a writer, and she promised God that she would write her story as a book one day. During the night, sometimes she would write things down so she wouldn't forget them by morning. It was hard for her to do when she was sick and tired, but she did it anyway.

Jesus knew this when He wrote in the same place where she wrote. As a writer, it meant a lot to her

that *He healed her not by His touch, but by His WORD.*

Mom explained to me how she used to ask Him for the final chapter to her book. You know, the “happily ever after” part. She didn't know He would show up and write!

I started jumping on the bed. Today would be GREAT!

When we got to the studio, I told Sid what God told me, and he said, "That sounds like God to me!"
